

Tillandsia Care

General guidelines. You may find your environment requires a little more or a little less.

LIGHT: Indirect or bright filtered light.

DISPLAY: These plants are natural epiphytes and can be placed in terrariums, hung, or mounted onto wood. The majority of this plant family do not need to be potted in soil.

WATER: IMPORTANT! Airplants are sensitive to the chemicals we add to our tap water. Let the water sit out for at least 20 minutes - then soak your airplants bottoms up for 15 mins to overnight 1-2x's per week. Light misting in-between soakings can help in dry environments. *note: most airplants have a "silverish" look when they are dry. Use this as your gauge as you become more familiar.

GROOMING: Airplants will become brittle to the touch if too dry and you can trim off any browning of the leaves.

FERTILIZER: Use a few drops of orchid fertilizer in a spray bottle (not a necessity but can encourage blooming)

*These plants can go outside in the summer but they must have protection from full sun and be watered daily.
