

**Oxalis** | These beauties like bright, but not direct, light and consistent moisture. They freak out when too dry (i.e. completely collapse) but can rebound when watered again. Don't let them freak out too many times though, or they may not come back! They get their name from the presence of oxalic acid in their leaves so unfortunately are toxic to pets.

- 🔆 Light: Bright indirect
- **Water: Consistent moisture (don't let fully dry out), so 2x per week depending on environment**
- Soil: General houseplant soil

**Irish Moss** | This cushy cutie also likes consistent moisture, but is sensitive to standing water. It can handle less light than Oxalis, which equates to BRIGHT SHADE indoors. And it blooms with the sweetest little white flowers. Fun fact: we carry Irish Moss as a perennial ground-cover in the outdoor months! If planting outdoors, it needs partial shade or it gets crispy.

- 🔆 Light: Bright shade
- **Water: Consistent moisture, but does not like standing water**
- A Soil: General houseplant soil
